

FR. MARK'S NOTES

THANK YOU, FR. PATRICK

In the name of all of you and myself, I would like to thank Fr. Patrick for spending the week with you so I could go on retreat. I got a chance to talk with him privately about his parish, which is poor beyond measure. His collection is probably \$5 a month. There are no churches in the 13 places he visits as his parish. Mass is mostly outside or in something like we would have as a pavilion. So, his parishes depend on his community, the Missionaries of St. Paul (MSP), and any money we can give them to sustain themselves. He told me his big projects are clean water, a school, and his parishioners' mental and physical health. The mortality rate is terrible, but he had no figures because they simply were unavailable, and that's only the tip of the iceberg.

So thanks to the Missionary of St. Paul. Fr. Patrick was very complimentary about you, your hospitality, and how you just jumped in and did things. He was also complimentary about how well things run! He said the place doesn't need me; the parish runs so efficiently, -a compliment to all of you and your love for your Faith and parish. I was, of course, happy to hear all that about you. Fr. Patrick was very genuine with all his comments.


