

# **FATHER MARK'S NOTES**

### 2021 Catholic Ministries Drive

I just wanted to mention once again and simply remind you about our Catholic Ministries Drive. As I previously mentioned, the entire focus of this initiative is different. Let me explain: the monies collected by this new "Drive" (I'll call it the 2021 CMD) will go exclusively to: caring for the poor, strengthening families, nurturing youth, and for the formation of clergy and laity. It will not go to the Diocesan general budget, which is where most of it went before. Not most but 100% of all funding will go to these vital ministries. Therefore, the funding will go to ministries that impact people in parishes and communities. That is very different from how the old ACA worked.

Also, the Diocese will be doing everything it can to keep administrative expenses to a minimum, I think 2%, while doing everything it can to keep these vital ministries that we will be supported, sustained and viable.

Again, our target amount here at OMOS is \$90,928. The target for St. Michael's is \$6,891. Now, if we all give a little this can be light work for us. In the past, we have hit 45% participation and met the goal easily. What would happen if we hit 100% participation? I think we should try to do what we can to hit that target amount. Again, with this new approach, the Diocese is trying to keep ministries that affect everyday people going, while also keeping the Diocese financially solvent.

More later, but thank you for reading this, and I simply ask you to pray and keep an open heart as you discern, as members of the Church of Altoona-Johnstown, how you may enter this financial commitment to your local Church.

This Thursday, April 22, is Confirmation for many of our young people. As I mentioned in my announcements, we would like you to pray for them. In the back of the Church is a basket with the names of our candidates. Could you take one – or if you wish two or three – and pray for them this week. We want to continue to see them as part of the life of the parish.

The Martha & Mary House, operated by Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown, is a homeless shelter at 899 Bedford St. in Johnstown. The Martha & Mary House provides support, safety, and hope to individuals and families in the form of shelter, planning, and caring case managers. The shelter can accommodate up to 15 people, and residents can stay for up to 30 daysenough time to secure financial stability and a more permanent residence.

# **Assistance Ministry Collection**

**Collection for the Food Pantry -** When you are at the grocery store, pick up a couple of extra items for the food pantry. Non-perishable items such as peanut butter, canned vegetables, pasta, sauce, canned tuna, etc. Also, we collect for the monthly tuna noodle casserole dinner at St. Vincent DePaul; the items are large bags of egg noodles, large cans of tuna, and cream of mushroom soup. The containers for the food collection are located in Holy Grounds. Drop off on our porch or place items inside in our bins inside to the left.

# **OMOS ASSISTANCE MINISTRY ACTIVITY REPORT FOR 2020**

Families in our area are struggling quietly to make ends meet. One setback can put a family into serious financial trouble. This year, the COVID 19 pandemic caused many to lose their jobs. Some waited and waited for unemployment checks to arrive. Others who had been making minimum wage had nothing to fall back on. Some ended up homeless. Shelter became an immediate problem, especially during these cold months.

Our parish family understands the changing needs and generously makes it possible for the Assistance Ministry to offer help to those less fortunate. Because of you, we can help parishioners – our priority – and others in the community who seek help from a position of authentic need.

Dedicated parish members, who are anonymous, have an assigned day to call into the parish office to take messages that are left on extension #1 throughout the day. It is a mission that requires skill, good judgment, tact, compassion, concern, and confidentiality.

Requests cover a wide range of needs: heating oil, eyeglasses, Scrip for a family in crisis, and more. When the utility moratorium ends, the ministry will be deluged with requests for help. Every dollar given to the ministry provides help to others.

As a ministry, the members listen with the ears of Christ and act with the love and mercy He gives. We partner with the parishioners in these acts of charity. Thank you for your incredible generosity and for continuing to be

a blessing to our sisters and brothers in need.
