

- 172 Children in 72 families were gifted food & presents from our Angel Tree, with \$5,700 donated





# Ministries

To channel our efforts and to ensure we are living our mission, we identified everything we do as a parish into our six areas of ministry. This allows us to focus our events and activities while striving to be a parish of evangelization and intentional discipleship.

### Liturgy

Participating in the sacred liturgy of the Mass provides us with the opportunity to be in complete communion with Jesus Christ. We strive to make this experience impactful and welcoming to anyone who comes through our doors. From a friendly welcome to engaging music, we seek and hear clearly the message Jesus has for us. The celebration of Mass is the most important gift we can offer to everyone. We look forward to the weekends where we can, as a community, spend time in worship and fellowship.

#### Prayer

The power of prayer can often and easily be overlooked. We need to continually remind ourselves that it's through prayer that God speaks to us. Prayer allows us the opportunity to talk to God but more importantly is the opportunity to listen to God. Through our Prayer Ministry we have ministers that will pray for you, with you and pray for any intention you may be seeking. These prayer sessions are available weekly on Wednesday mornings, Sundays between Mass, and monthly on First Fridays. Prayer requests are also taken through our website and shared with our prayer ministers who pray daily for our intentions.

### Operations

The operations of a parish this size and age encompass more than keeping the grass cut and the bills paid. While these details are necessary, it also requires direction and guidance from the Finance Council, Leadership Team, Parish Council and other parish leaders to always be aware of trends and insightful strategic thinking processes that we could be utilizing within our operations.

#### Outreach

The Great Commission from Jesus calls us to love and serve others. Our mission to "be a beacon of light in Johnstown" comes to life through our Outreach Ministries, serving both parish members and the wider community. This includes prayer requests to providing meals for families in need. Our Assistance Ministry helps us support those in our parish and beyond. Your generosity and support of these outreach efforts beautifully express your love for others.

### **Youth Ministry**

With the dedication of our teachers and volunteers, we have walked alongside our students in their faith journey. Our Liturgy of the Word during Sunday Mass for K-2nd grade, Youth Formation between Masses for K-8, and High School Ministry for grades 9-12, we've provided students a path to encounter Christ at their level. We want them to know that they are loved and cared for by their parish family. We have prepared them for their sacraments, engaged over 75 kids during Vacation Bible School, and we pray for our graduates as they head into the world to find their calling.

### **Faith Formation**

Our Parish Formation classes continue to grow, with a variety of options offered for everyone. With classes between Sunday Masses, weekly sessions during the day and evenings, and summer courses, we've brought together eager learners. Our small groups foster deep connections, and our Alpha Team has faithfully offered the Alpha course for 10 years. Even in the virtual world, our daily Liturgy of the Word and Sunday night Follow Your Faith programs have maintained and grown their faithful viewership. We should never stop seeking to understand God's plan for us all.
