RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS What We Carry from Town to Town

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the ones who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door and the those who don't.

People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade is: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we've been — whether it's a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit many figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness, shame, defeat, anger, fear, and doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of them, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we're tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the "town" God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a challenging conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, or a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don't let a past disappointment constrain you. Don't allow yesterday's failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today's witness, whatever form it might take.
