FYF (Follow Your Faith)

Thanks to everyone who watched us last Sunday as we shared our experience at the Alpha Collective in London. We barely scratched the surface, and there's so much more. We want to talk about the actual content of some of the talks. Nicky Gumbel said some remarkable things. There was a section on the youth where they rolled out the new Youth Alpha Series that we will be doing here in January. (Maybe we can show the trailer?) There was a section on prayer and how they saw the future of the Church. That part about the future was especially interesting because a priest from Chicago presented it, and we could all relate to it. So, join us as we dive deeper into the experience we want to share with you.

Vocations

Our new Vocations Team met this past week. We talked about a lot of stuff. We want to share things about vocations with our youth, our parents, and the whole parish. You will notice that we have begun and will continue to pray for vocations, to the priesthood, religious life for both men and women, sacramental marriage, and committed single life. It was our first meeting, and we have much more to do, but I just wanted to alert all of you and, above all, ask you to pray for each of these vocations.

Prayer Ministry/Weekly Prayer Intentions

Pray for their teachers and pray we continually seek to improve things for them so they may genuinely embrace Jesus and the life of the Church.
