

NOTE FROM FR. MARK

One More Christmas Card

On the Feast of the Holy Family, I shared a few notes written on various Christmas cards. I did that to share with everyone that many, indeed, carry very heavy burdens, and this time of the year is particularly difficult. And also, I wanted to remind you that the Holy Family carried heavy burdens as well, and we should not romanticize their difficult and demanding lives. Just this week, I received a "Christmas card." There was no return address, and I have no idea who sent the letter, but I thought I needed to share it with you. As you will see, the letter was very heartfelt and speaks about this suffering I wished to share with all of you. I know many of you share this pain, and we must always be aware of it! Here is the letter:

Dear Fr. Mark,

One More Christmas Card

On December 28th, I was a visitor and attended your 4:00 Mass. The Mass was very beautiful, but not so much for me this Christmas season. When I sat down, I said to myself, "God, please let his sermon speak to me." And, yes, did God come through! Reading those Christmas cards was quite poignant/impressive, not just for me, but I am sure for many others suffering through Christmas without a loved one. You see, I recently lost my beloved wife, leaving me alone with no children or family, the last survivor. The emotional pain is palpable and, at times, unbearable. The inescapable festivities of the holidays flood the senses with lights, food, decorations, music, TV, etc., as they surround everyone for months. It appears as if everyone around you is carefree and happy. But you reading those cards brought everyone to stark reality. It reminded me and the congregation that many others are suffering during the holidays and every day, many sitting in those seats in front of you, as you acknowledged. So, I just wanted to thank you for sharing those Christmas cards.

I also wanted to thank you for speaking out on behalf of the immigrants, the majority of whom, as you said, want to come to this country with their children to make a better life. **Families!**
